The Cummings Center was built on one of the largest and oldest industrial sites in the United States, once home to United Shoe Machinery Corporation, Drohosky said. At its height more than 7,000 employees worked at the site, making machines sold to shoe manufacturers.

When the Cummings Properties owner bought the former United Shoe site in 1996 the owner decided to keep the original buildings.

The owner also committed to being a steward of the site, by exhibiting original United Shoe manufacturing equipment, from staplers to cutting machines, and hundreds of vintage photographs.
